MONTESSORI **AND PEACE**

While Maria Montessori's work primarily focused on educational principles, her philosophy also embraced the profound connection between education and peace. She believed that fostering a child's natural curiosity and independence could contribute to the development of peaceful individuals and societies.

Montessori observed that when children are given the freedom to explore and learn at their own pace, they develop a sense of self-discipline, empathy, and a respect for others.
