Do read on and enjoy sharing those moments together over the Christmas period of joyful chatting, card and thank you note sharing! As we know all forms of expression support the written word.

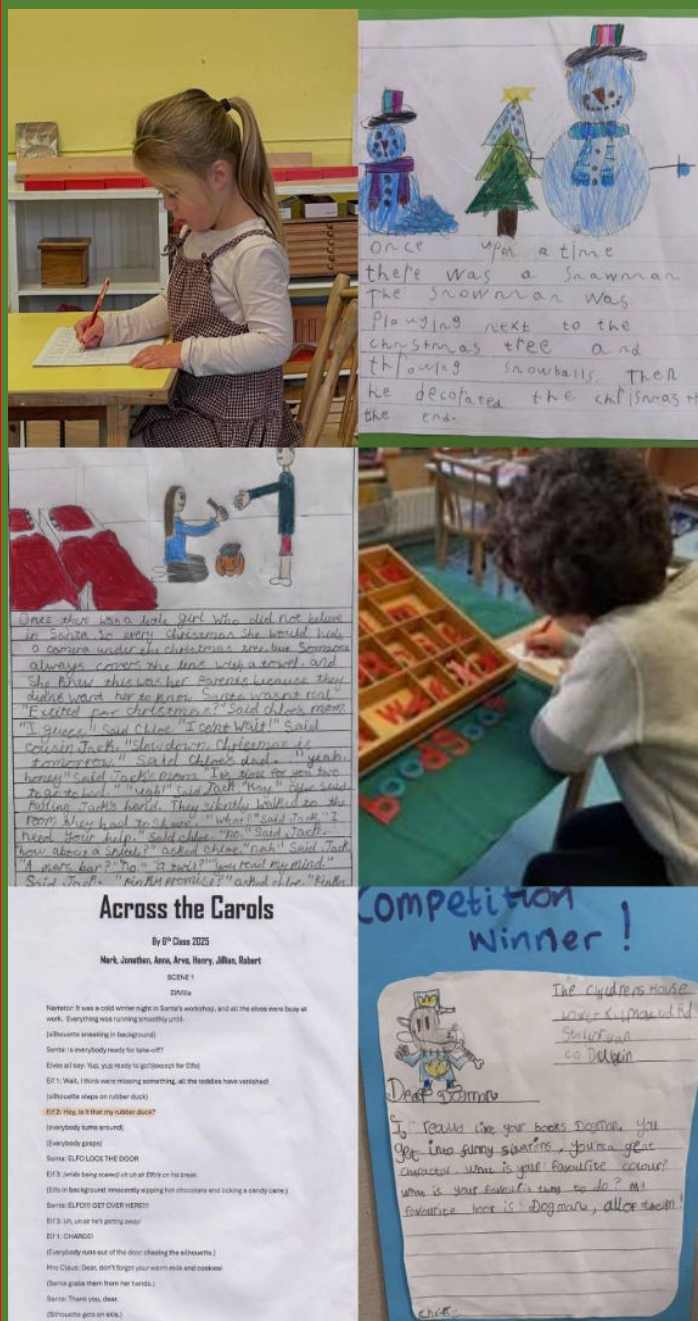

## THE WRITING ROAD TO READING

*As in all Montessori practice Maria Montessori believed in isolation of difficulty:*

- In the 3-6 Classes the children are encouraged to develop oral expression and vocabulary – they play the Eye Spy game and learn how words are broken into sounds.
- With the sandpaper letters they learn what the sounds look like. They can then put letters together with the movable alphabet to form words. As they do this they are writing.
- Parallel to this they do Practical Life exercises to strengthen their pincer grip and then they use chalk to form letters. Finally after much preparation they are given a pencil.
- With coloured pencils they do the metal insets and eventually they write letters and numbers.
- In parallel reading emerges naturally.
- In the 6-9 Class they work on their penmanship. Fueled by their creativity and expanding imagination they write great stories, make comic books, do projects, take part in the MS ReadAthon activities nationwide and start to look at the grammar in their writing.
- Ongoing research feeds the intellect of the 9-12 Class children and they learn how to create PowerPoints, Calligraphy and take part in song writing.
- Over the years they act in each other's plays and in the last year of the 9-12 Class they write the Christmas play for the class performance.
- It is wonderful to look back at the children's journeys over the years and keep in mind the preciousness of the spoken word where it all began!
